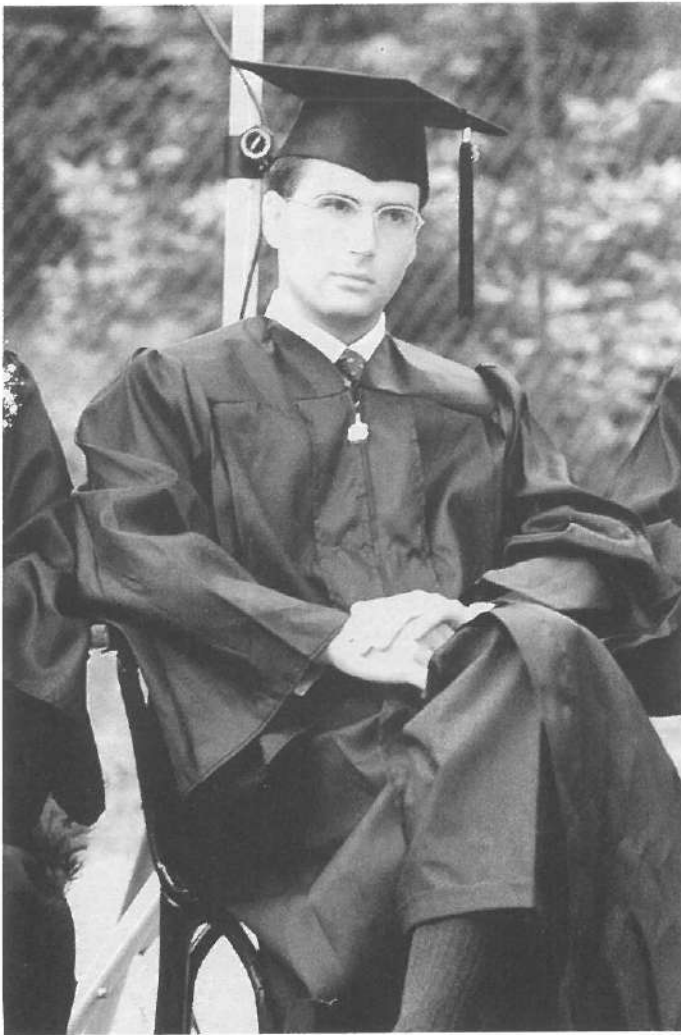
Senior year is a very important time for all of us. It is a big turning point. It is time to understand ourselves and realize our dreams.
