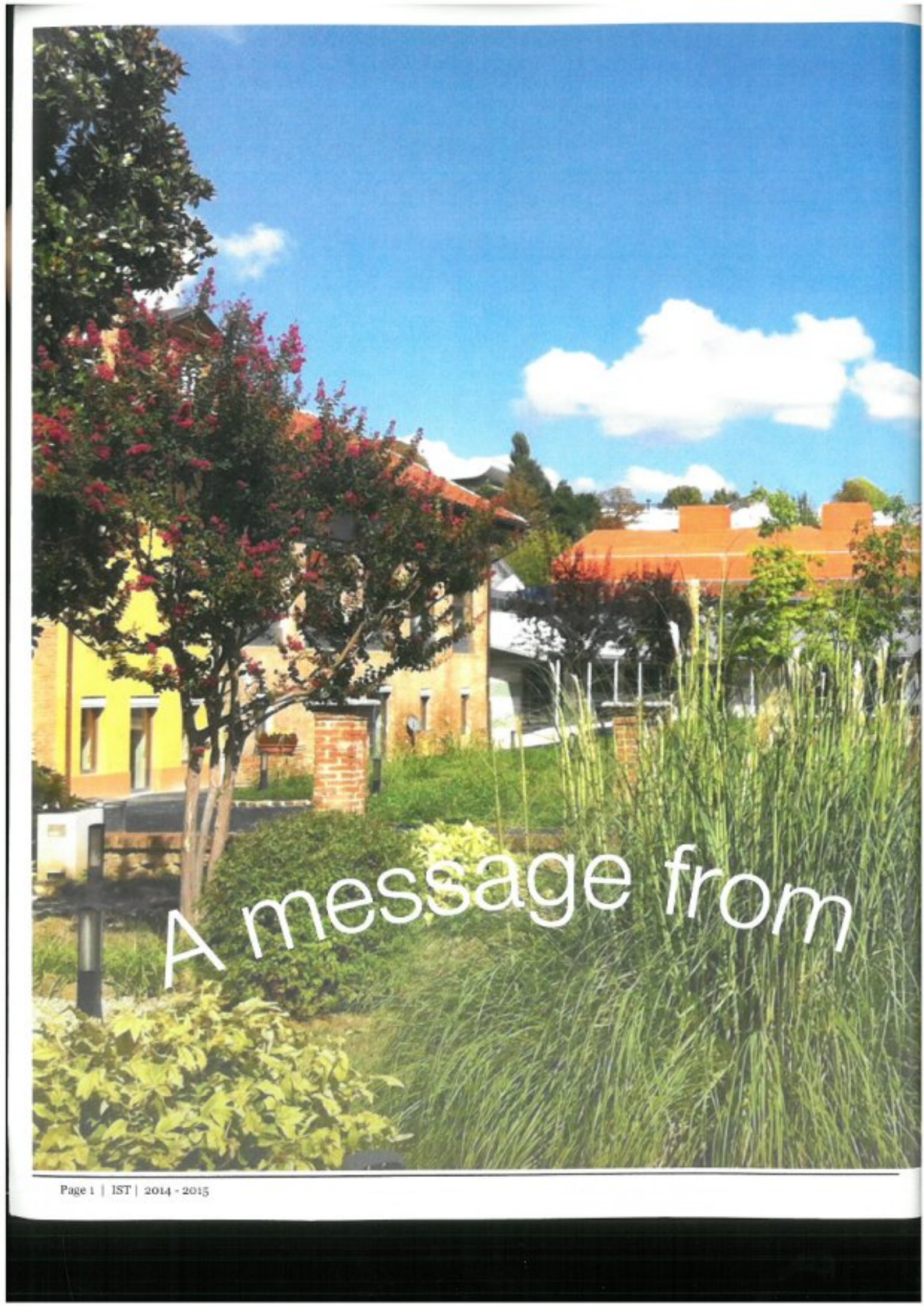

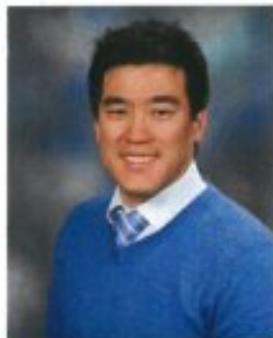

The opening of the Atelier has had a big impact on creativity this year. The hands-on activities have provided many meaningful, creative experiences as well as fostering self-confidence and an excitement for creativity. This unique learning environment has also provided rich and varied opportunities for in-depth exploration and discovery while incorporating the broader goals of language development, science inquiry, math awareness, creative arts exploration, and social and emotional growth.

The word Atelier means 'artists workshop, creative space' and under the guidance of Scarlett Dalton and Young Melmoth creativity has certainly been happening. Scarlett and Young have also emphasized the use of recycled materials in the Atelier, which aligns itself with the school's ECO vision.

There have been many stimulating trips this year in the ECEC, which have supported the curriculum and enabled the students to learn about the world around them. We have also had several guest speakers from the IST community who have volunteered to come into school and share their knowledge and/or expertise with the students to support their learning.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PYP COORDINATOR Ms. Susan Baker

This has been a very productive year for the PYP. The students have worked hard on developing their international mindedness across the curriculum through the development of their learner profile attributes, transdisciplinary skills and attitudes. There have been many great examples of students developing their international mindedness this year, such as Nursery and Pre-K learning to be caring towards one another and sharing resources through play. Kindergarten becoming more knowledgeable about the world around them by exploring different cultures, the weather and why plants are important to life. Grade 1 have become good thinkers by thinking scientifically about the properties of materials and designing and building a suitable shelter for an animal.

In the Lower School, Grade 2 have shown that they are both balanced and principled by finding out about the world of work and experiencing how to run their own market stall. They demonstrated their balanced attitude by donating their earnings to the school community garden rather than using it for themselves.

Grade 3 have shown they are risk takers by taking part in a group marathon around the piazza. The children had to push their minds and bodies in order to complete the running challenge. Grade 4 have become inquirers by learning the necessary skills to carry out research effectively. These skills have enabled them to learn about early civilisations, life cycles and ecosystems. They have also become open minded as they have learnt about the political and geographical boundaries of a country and paid a visit to the International Labour Organisation (ILO), a specialised agency of the United Nations in Turin. Grade 5 have ended their PYP Journey by demonstrating that they are good communicators. They shared their research with the community during the PYP Exhibition and demonstrated being reflective; thinking about what they had found out during their research and deciding on how they could take action to help solve the issues they identified. All students should feel proud of the progress they have made in their life long journey to become global citizens; appreciating and caring for one another and the world as well as taking positive action to protect it and each other.

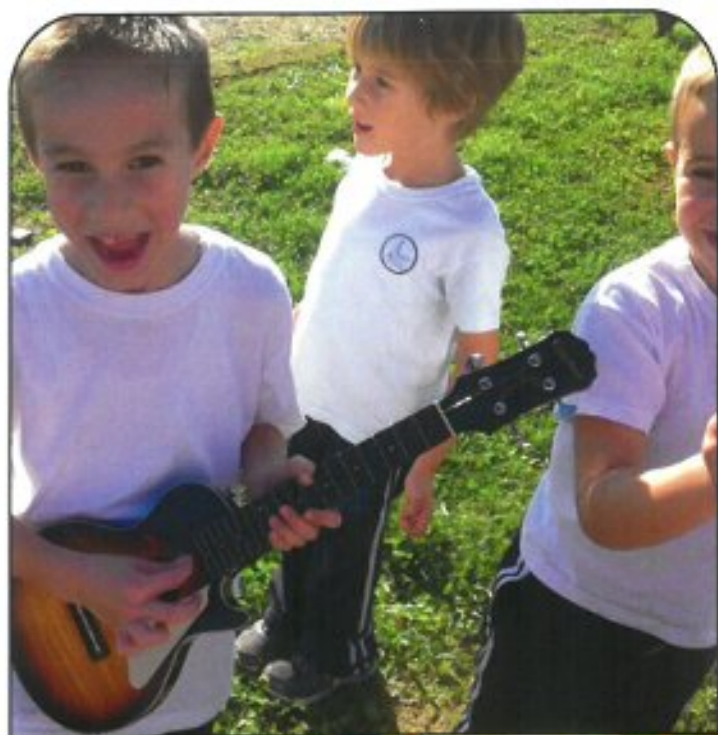


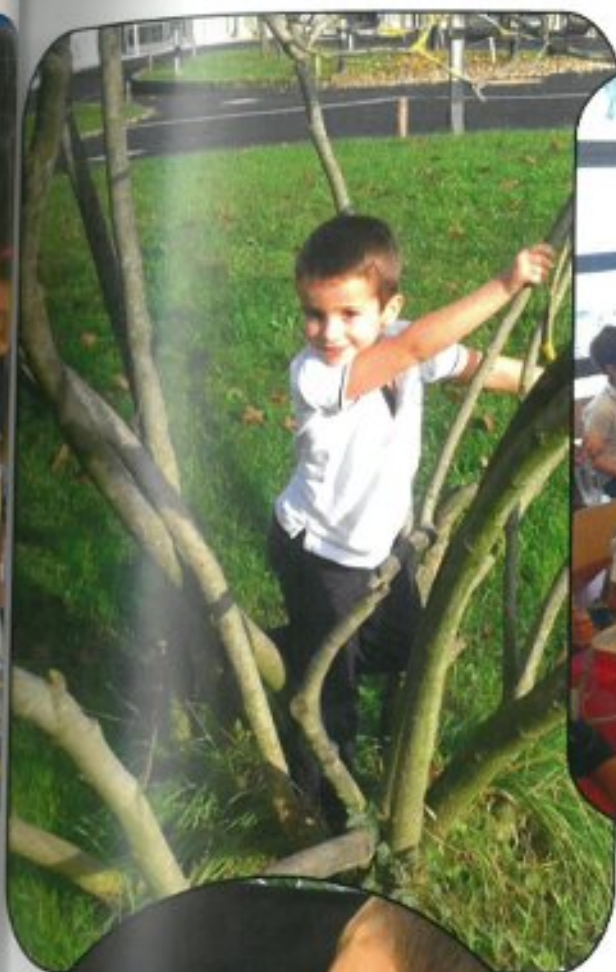

Some of the highlights of this year include: The Grade 2 students inquired into jobs in the community and visited the local Chieri market, after this visit, they made their own goods and sold them in the school; using the money they earned to support the school garden! The Grade 3 students investigated the physical features of the Earth and how it changes over time. The students then shared their interactive 3-D models of landforms with a digital presentation to their parents as 'professionals' in their fields.

Their learning soared when they went to the Genoa Aquarium and took part in an interactive lab on vertebrates and invertebrates. 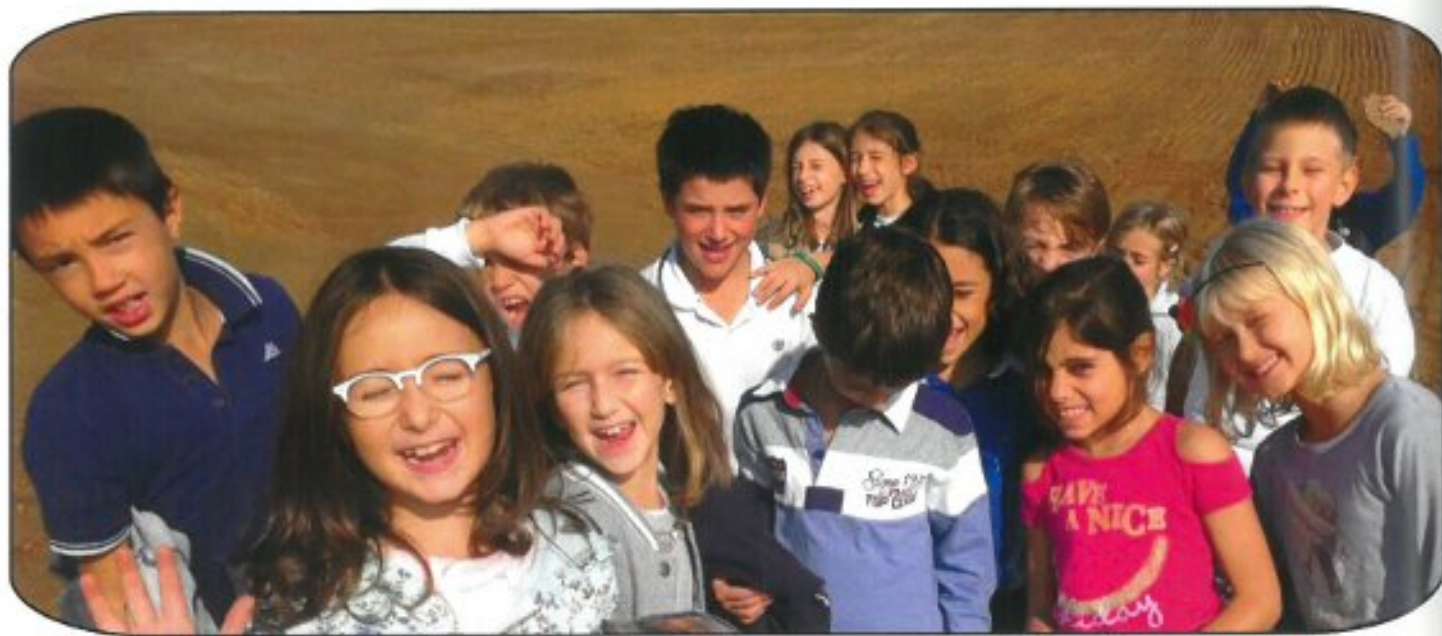

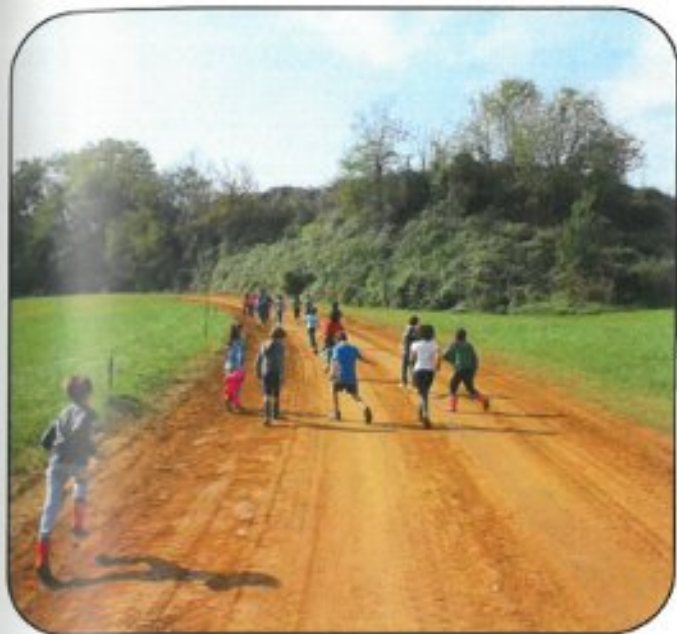

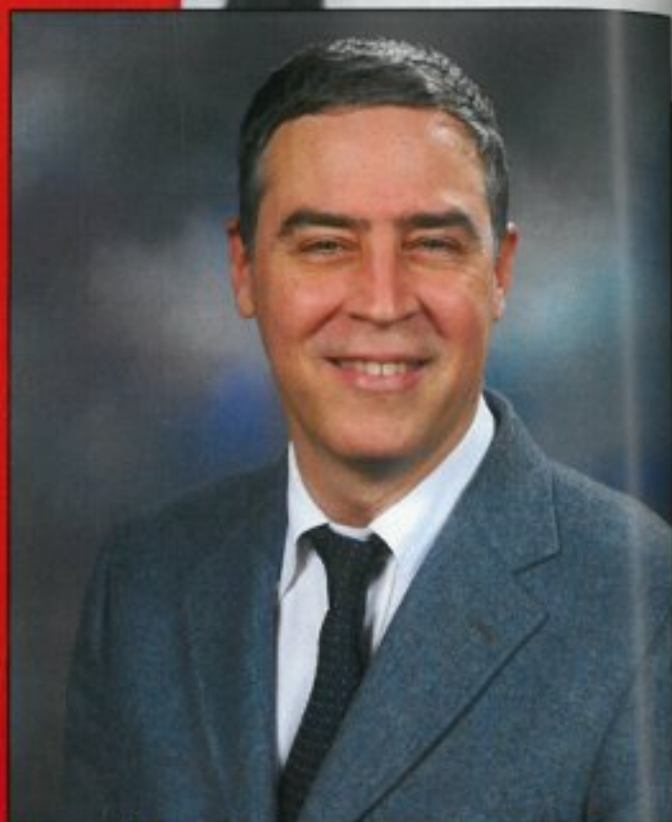




A MESSAGE FROM THE UPPER SCHOOL DEAN

Our Grade 9 students have embraced the opportunities offered by the Upper School program. Many students in this class have taken part in the Model United Nations conferences and have volunteered their services at Casa Santa Luisa, a local organization which cares for the needy. In April, the Class of 2018 travelled to Poland as part of a cross-curricular study unit. As for Grade 10, highlights of the year included development of Personal Projects, the Work Experience Week and the field trip to Ireland. Work Experience Week included placements at the United Nations and Juventus Football Club, and several students conducted their Work Experience outside of Italy. Many of the Grade 10 students took leading roles in the TOMUN Conference, which enjoyed widespread support from various other schools.



The Diploma programme is the final of the three IB programmes that lead our students on to the path of higher education. The challenging academic nature of the programme includes a variety of subjects in different disciplines which allow candidates to be prepared for life after high school as well as upholding all the features of the Learner Profile. 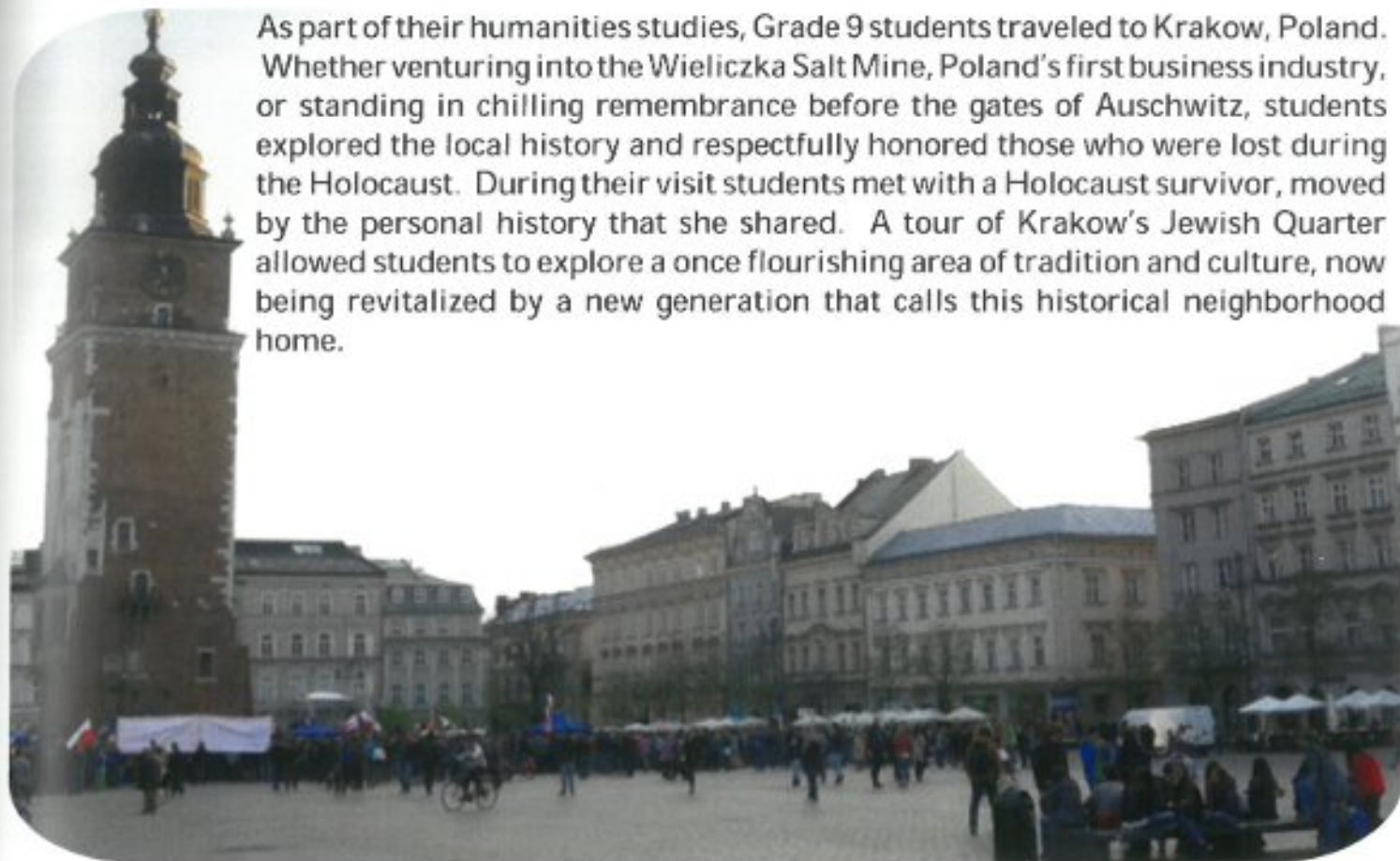

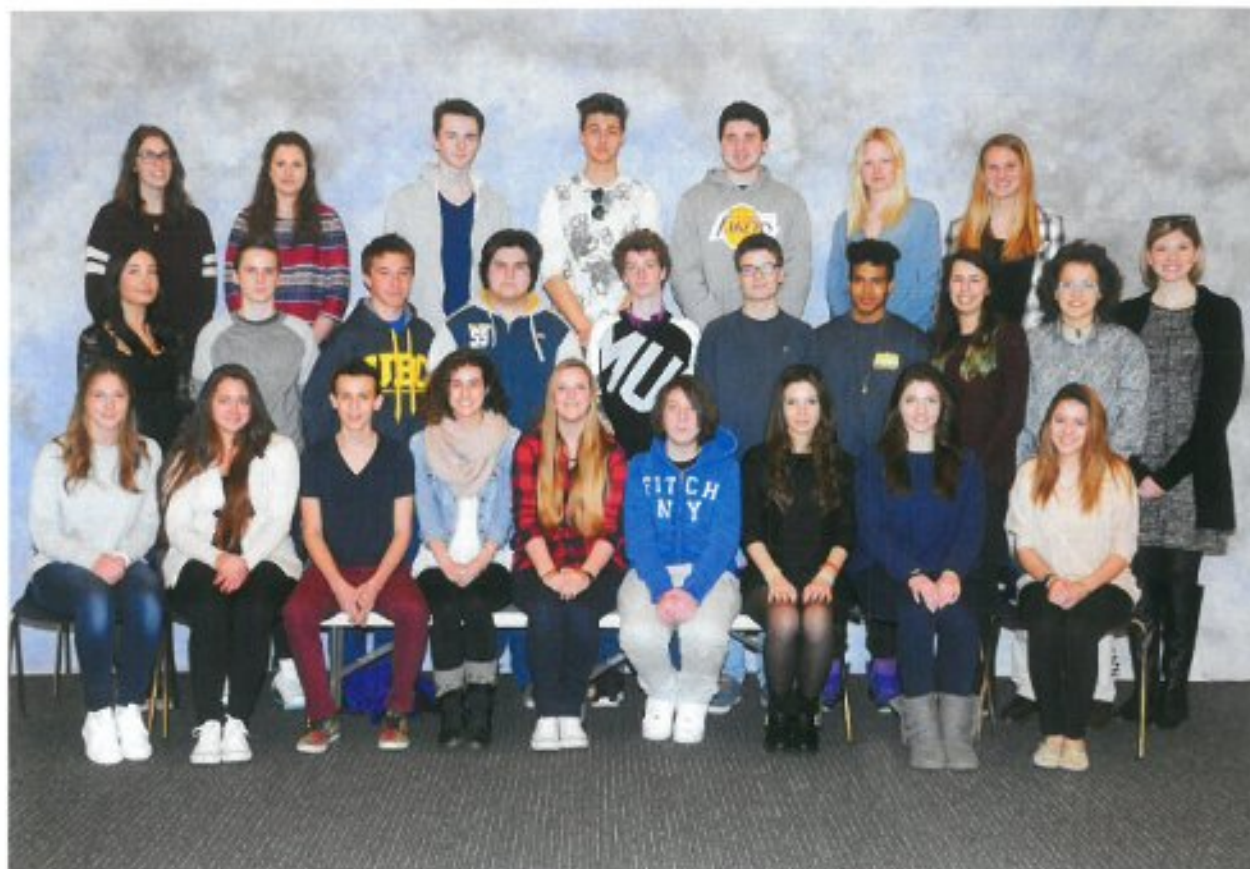




A MESSAGE FROM THE DP COORDINATOR Ms. Clara Siviero
