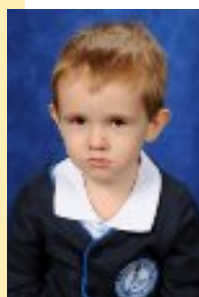

A note from the Lower School Dean: Ms. Michele Conway Gaudet

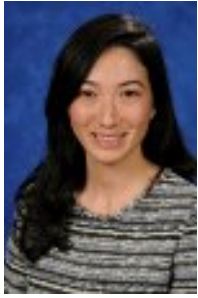
Throughout the 2016-17 Academic Year in the Lower School, we focussed on further developing the IB learner profile attributes. The profile aims to develop learners who are inquirers, knowledgeable, thinkers, communicators, principled, open-minded, caring, risk-takers, balanced and reflective. Every two weeks we focussed in depth on a learner profile attribute as a Lower School. Students recognized the positive behaviors and attitudes in each other and stars were given to encourage continuous development of a community of learners who are internationally minded. We celebrated individuals in the Lower School weekly Friday Assembly for their efforts! Grade 1 students became disciplined and knowledgeable in the addition and subtraction math facts in the Rocket Math program. This skill allowed them to dive deeper into critical thinking in the Singapore math program. Grade 2 students became very knowledgeable in all the units by rising to the challenge to become high level thinkers by using complex vocabulary in the end of unit projects and open classroom. Grade 3 students blossomed into critical thinkers which was clearly evident on the trip to the Asti fossil museum where they had to work together to be successful! Grade 4 students were inquirers and communicators when they participated in the science fair extravaganza, focusing on mixing solutions to create change of state. Grade 5 engaged in collaborative team building experiences by going to the Parco Avventura where they were risk-takers playing together in their natural surroundings. This trip prepared them well for the residential trip where they demonstrated teamwork while hiking, climbing, biking, canoeing, kayaking and rafting. I was most impressed with the Leadership qualities of the Lower School Student Council and Eco Club. The Student Council came up with many memorable activities. The highlights of the year were Spirit week, 100th day of school celebration, soccer tournaments and the ISTalent Show. The Eco Club met regularly to plan campaigns for the Lower School. A few of the successful campaigns were; not wasting food in the cafeteria, dividing the rubbish properly, recycling and a campaign to not waste paper and reusing paper. All of these opportunities were supported and created by our talented and dedicated teachers and assistants! This year we truly reflected the learner profile attributes which created an environment which fostered student development and critical thinking!
